Description

** [TWO STARS] At the start of his solo show, Mike Schlitt walks on stage in distressed jeans, black Converse sneakers, thin-framed glasses and a pea-green, short-sleeved button-down shirt. The set—a red Ikea chair, a thin silver lamp and a movie screen—is as unassuming as he is, and as slight as his show. For the next 80 minutes or so, the writer-performer (who identifies himself as “Jew-ish”) offers commentary on 33 movies about Jesus, snippets of which are shown on the adjacent screen; this miniseminar is threaded with a discussion of his own lack of faith, as well as anecdotes from his experience as a postproduction manager at Sony, working on what he admits may be the worst Jesus film ever made, *The Revolutionary*. Some of the clips are good for a laugh—Jesus with an Afro! Jesus Christ as a vampire hunter!—and there is a funny sequence about the link between actors in Jesus movies and porn flicks. But you won’t leave feeling satisfied, either religiously or comically.—Anna Brand, *Seek* intern

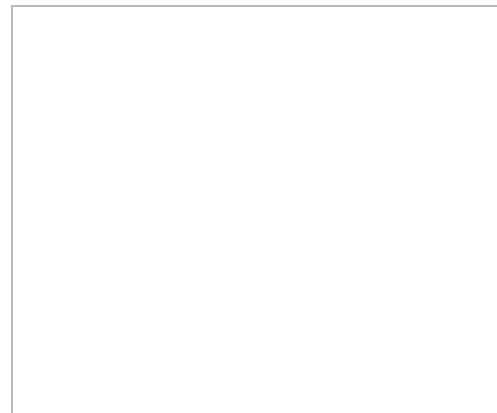
